#### **Triadic Color Scheme**

- A triadic color scheme uses colors at the points of an equilateral triangle (three colors spaced equally on the color wheel).
- Sometimes referred to as a balanced color scheme
  - i.e. yellow-green, red-orange, and blue-violet



### Split-Complement Color Scheme



- A split-compliment color scheme includes a main color and the two colors on each side of its complementary (opposite) color on the color wheel.
- An example of a splitcompliment color scheme could be green, violet-red, and red-

# Analogous Colors



- These colors are located next to each other on the wheel, such as:
  - Blue, Blue-green, Green
  - Red, Red-Orange, and Orange
- Analogous colors are sometimes called harmonious colors.


### **Complementary Colors**



Any 2 colors which are directly opposite each other on the color wheel.

> such as: Red & Green Blue & Orange Yellow & Violet

#### Monochromatic Colors

Monochromatic color scheme means "One Color". It is a color scheme that uses only one hue and all the values (tints and shades) of that hue.
