Intermediate Colors



- Yellow Green
- Yellow Orange
- Red Orange
- Red Violet
- Blue Violet
- Blue Green

Colors formed by mixing a primary and secondary

The Warm and Cool Color Scheme

Warm colors range from:

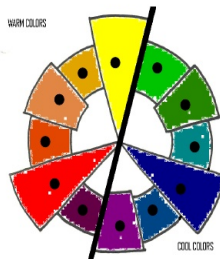
- yellow
- yellow-orange
- orange
- red-orange
- red
- red-violet

and are colors that advance towards you.

Cool colors range from:

- yellow-green
- green
- blue-green
- blue
- blue violet
- violet

and are colors that recede or go into the picture



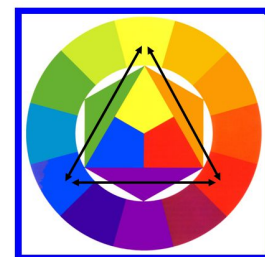

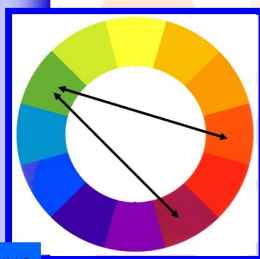

Triadic Color Scheme

- A triadic color scheme uses colors at the points of an equilateral triangle (three colors spaced equally on the color wheel).
- Sometimes referred to as a balanced color scheme
 - i.e. yellow-green, red-orange, and blue-violet

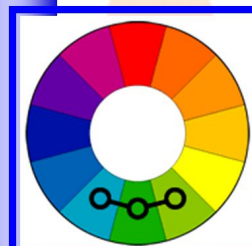


Split-Complement Color Scheme



- A split-complement color scheme includes a main color and the two colors on each side of its complementary (opposite) color on the color wheel.
- An example of a split-complement color scheme could be green, violet-red, and red-orange.

Analogous Colors



- These colors are located next to each other on the wheel, such as:
 - Blue, Blue-green, Green
 - Red, Red-Orange, and Orange
- Analogous colors are sometimes called harmonious colors.

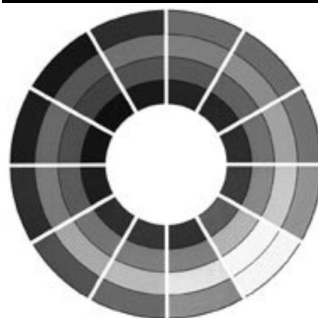
Complementary Colors



Any 2 colors which are directly opposite each other on the color wheel.

such as:
Red & Green
Blue & Orange
Yellow & Violet

Achromatic-all the ranges between black and white



MONOCHROMATIC COLORS

Monochromatic color scheme means "One Color". It is a color scheme that uses only one hue and all the values (tints and shades) of that hue.
