AUDITION PREPARATION

Lobby opens a half hour before auditions. Arrive in time to fill out an audition form and get a head shot. Please bring your calendar and provide a complete list of rehearsal conflicts.

Monologues: All auditioners will be asked to read a monologue from the show. The director has selected options for Sidney, Clifford, Myra and Helga, which are available on the SAAC website or in the office. Work on it at home (there will be time at auditions to work on it). Memorizing the monologue is preferred. You will be given some direction and then perform it again.

Scene Readings: The director will provide scene readings for Auditions and Callbacks. No advance preparations is necessary. Auditioners are encouraged to read the script before auditions. Script copies are available at the SAAC Office and may be checked out for a period of 48 hours for reading.

Audition Prep and Planning with Director Gary Hall Open House • Saturday, Sept. 10, 5:30-7:30pm

Gary's love affair with SAAC began in 1975 with children's theatre. He has since performed in and directed multiple shows at SAAC and other venues. His most recent work was *The Three Musketeers* (the show that shut the world down). Some of his favorite productions to direct have included *Sunset Blvd*, *Picnic* and *Damn Yankees* to name a few.



Gary is currently Director of Entertainment and Media Arts at SouthArk and is very excited to partner with SAAC as an opportunity for SouthArk students to work in a practical venue and support our community. He received his Master's in Theatre from Louisiana Tech and his Bachelor's in Radio, TV and Film from UALR. In 2021 he was named Outstanding Faculty Member at SouthArk and has no plans to stop supporting students or SAAC any time soon.

Sidney Bruhl • Lead, Male, 45-60. Writer of mystery plays who's suffering from a recent run of flops, which has caused him a great deal of angst. Self-assured if not, self-absorbed. Convinced of his own brilliance and somewhat entitled. Heavy on the drama and quick to overdramatize. Too clever for his own good. Not effeminate at all, but basically, a male drama queen.

Clifford Anderson • Lead, Male, 20-30. Handsome student with a masked self-absorption hidden under his portrayed innocence which adds to his appeal. Fit and somewhat boyish. Seemingly Sidney's intellectual equal despite his ambition. He's smart and wants everyone to know it. His looks get him in the door, his brains knock you on the floor.

Myra Bruhl • Supporting, Female, 40-60. Sidney's mildly neurotic wife. Easily excitable. Carries an air of sophistication but somewhat naïve. Completely devoted to Sidney. Not nearly as simple as she appears. There's really a lot more here to explore than what is on the immediate surface.

Helga ten Dorp • Supporting, 30+. Dutch psychic with an air of mystery. Keeps everyone guessing if she is sincere or just a charlatan. Highly eccentric, but unexpectedly sly and a wee bit conniving. A great chance for a character actress to shine.

Proctor Milgrim • Supporting, Male, 30+. Sidney's attorney with a fine eye for detail; suspicious of everyone...or is he? Lots of opportunities to play with what drives him.



In Ira Levin's classic comedic thriller, Deathtrap, a washed-up playwright finds a chance to rise to the top once more, a shot he'd be willing to kill for. The Story: Seemingly comfortably ensconced in his charming Connecticut home, **Sidney Bruhl**, a successful writer of Broadway thrillers, is struggling to overcome a "dry" spell which has resulted in a string of failures and a shortage of funds. A possible break in his fortunes occurs when he receives a script from a student in the seminar he has been conducting at a nearby college—a thriller which Sidney recognizes immediately as a potential Broadway hit. His wife, **Myra**, suggests the two men could collaborate, an idea which the younger man quickly accepts. When **Clifford** arrives later that evening, no one—not even **Helga**, the visiting psychic—could predict where the dark events of the night will go. Suspense mounts steadily as the plot begins to twist and turn with devilish cleverness, and with such an abundance of thrills and laughter, that audiences will be held enthralled until the final, startling moments of the play.
