#### PREPARING FOR AUDITIONS

Lobby opens a half hour before auditions. Arrive early to fill out an audition form and get a head shot. Wear comfortable clothes and shoes for a dance audition. Please bring your calendar and provide a complete list of rehearsal conflicts.

**Singing:** Prepare 16 bars from a song in the style of the show to sing at Auditions. Don't forget to bring your music. There will be no accompanist at auditions. Bring a music track on your phone/iPad/laptop that can connect by bluetooth or with an AUX cord (head phone jack) to our sound system or on a CD. (Optional if auditioning to just dance in the ensemble.) For Callbacks, music from the show will be assigned.

**Dancing:** Come prepared to perform a short musical theatre dance/movement combination. Preview the dance video to be familiar with the basic steps.

**Acting:** If auditioning for a lead role prepare a 1-2 minute monologue to present at Auditions. For Callbacks expect to read from the script. Scene reading will be made available the week of auditions.

**Bert** • The narrator, a one man band, sidewalk artist, chimney sweep, kite salesman, and friend to Mary Poppins. Charming and Charismatic. Cockney accent. Lead, Baritone, Dancer, 30's

**Mary Poppins** • Jane and Michael's new nanny who is extraordinary and strange with a dazzling personality. She is a force to be reckoned, full of hope even when things look dire, and practically perfect in every way. Lead, Soprano/Mezzo-soprano, must move well, 20's

**Michael Banks** • Cute and cheeky, excitable and sometimes naughty. Adores his father. Lead, Treble/Boy Soprano, 9-10 yrs\*

**Jane Banks •** High-spirited, bright, and precocious, but willful and occasionally snobbishness. Lead, Soprano, 11-12 yrs\*

**George Banks** • Head of the Banks household, a bank manager who tries to be a good provider, but often forgets how to be a good husband and father. Lead, Baritone, may speak-sing, 40's

**Winifred Banks** • A former actress who is very busy trying to live up to her husband's expectations. She is a loving but distracted mother to Jane and Michael. Supporting, Mezzo-soprano, 30's

**Mrs. Brill** • The Banks' family housekeeper and cook. Her intimidating exterior covers warmth underneath. Featured, Alto, 50's

**Robertson Ay** • Clumsy but good-hearted footman of the Banks household, has problems following directions, a knock-about comic character. "Spoonful" solo. Featured, Tenor, 20's.

Miss Andrew • George's overbearing and scary nanny who keeps naughty children in line. She is a bully who only knows one way of doing things - her way. Featured, Soprano with Alto belt, 40'-50's

**Mrs. Corry** • Mysterious old woman with a exotic accent that runs the magic gingerbread "Talking Shop". She knew George as a boy. Featured, Soprano, 40-50 & up.

**Neleus** • A statue in the park who has lost his father, befriended by Jane and Michael. Featured, Tenor, Dancer, Teen-20's

**The Bird Woman** • Sits in front of St. Paul's cathedral selling bags of crumbs for pigeons. Sings "Feed the Birds." Featured, Alto, 50's

**The Park Keeper** • Uniformed and officious, a stickler for rules and regulations, watches over the park. Featured, Tenor, 30-40's

**Admiral Boom** • A retired Royal Navy man, the Banks' family friendly neighbor on Cherry Tree Lane. Featured, Baritone, 50's

**Miss Lark** • A haughty neighbor of the Banks family who treats her dog as if her were child. Featured, Mezzo-Soprano, 30-40's

**Katie Nanna** • The last of a long line of nannies for Jane and Michael, had her fill of the children's pranks. Featured, Spoken, 40-50's

**Policeman** • A neighborhood fixture who is respected by and observant of households on his beat. 30-40's

Queen Victoria • A statue in the park, 40's

**Bank Chairman** • The head of the bank where Mr. Banks is employed, is an Edwardian stuffed-shirt. He can speak/sing his lines if necessary. Baritone, 50-60's

Miss Smythe • The Bank Chairman's humorless secretary. 40's

**Von Hussler** • A businessman seeking a loan from the bank for a shady business deal. German accent. 30's

**John Northbrook** • An honest business man seeking a loan to build a factory. Northern England accent. 30's

**ENSEMBLE** • A large group who sing and dance. Many small character parts and dancing solos.

Roles of Jane and Michael are open to anyone who can look 9-12, but no one younger than 9 years old. All other parts are open to anyone 14 and older.
