Scene Readings: Everyone will be asked to read from the script. No advanced preparations necessary. Sides are available for anyone interested in reviewing them before auditions.

Callbacks, if needed, will be scheduled directly with actors individual for a time TBD in the week following auditions.

Rehearsals: The first rehearsal will be Sunday, October 12 from 2-4pm. Expect rehearsals to run Sunday-Thursday, with Friday and Saturdays only added to the schedule close to production dates, but this is not guaranteed until after all cast scheduling conflicts are considered. A parent or guardian must attend the October 12, 2pm meeting with children under 18.

Production Dates: December 2, 3, 5, 6, 7

Adult Roles: 4 Males and 6 Women. Parts open for wide range of ages to play the pageant director, children's parents, members of the church, pastor, and firemen.

Youth Roles: 8 Boys, 6 Girls, and Ensemble. Parts open to any children who look 5 years to early teens, but must be 7 or older to audition. The choir will sing Christmas standards like *Oh Little Town of Bethlehem, Away in the Manger, Angels We Have Heard on High*, and *Silent Night*. (Treble/Boy Soprano)

Leroy Herdman. 10-11. Tough, very sure of himself.

Claude Herdman. 8-9. Tough, combative. A crime buddy to Ollie.

Ollie Herdman. 8-9 boy/girl. Always looking for trouble. Claude's usual partner in crime.

Gladys Herdman. 7-8. Small, wiry, feisty. Often funny; sometimes means it.

Alice Wendleken. 10-11. Prim, proper, pain in the neck

Maxine. 10-11. Beth's church Sunday school classmate.

Elmer Hopkins. 12-13. The minister's son; dislikes church; not fond of the Herdmans.
